# Our Activities - Government

# Singapore Competent Authorities on Chemical Management

Several agencies which regulates hazardous chemicals with specific inherent properties and at different stages of their life cycle.

The **Ministry of Manpower (MOM)** regulates the exposure to chemicals at workplaces.



The **National Environment Agency (NEA)** regulates hazardous substances which are highly toxic and/or generates toxic wastes.



**Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF)** regulates the storing and transportation of flammable materials including petroleum.



**Singapore Police Force (SPF)** regulates the manufacture and storage of explosive precursors.
